An analysis of the data indicates that there may be approximately 100 minor settlements per annum which are not submitted for court approval. However, evidence of the demographic profile of those children is unavailable. Nevertheless, it is unlikely that such children are disproportionately resident in rural areas. That said, mandatory court approval of all minor settlements may have an impact on people in rural areas if a court hearing for such approval is required.

areas <u>differently</u> from people in urban areas, please explain how it is likely to impact on people in rural areas differently.		
It may be that requiring all minor settlements to be approved by the court may present more difficulty for some children and their parents living in rural areas in terms of access to courthouses, caused by greater distance and less public transport availability when compared to those in urban areas. However this may be offset by the option of introducing a new paper-based procedure or a financial threshold.

Given the small numbers involved (c 100 children per annum) and the option of a paper-based procedure for obtaining court approval and/or a financial threshold being explored in the consultation paper, it was not considered that it was necessary to take any specific steps to identify the social and economic needs of people in rural areas. This impact assessment will be published alongside the consultation paper and, therefore, respondents will have the opportunity to comment on it if they wish. A further impact assessment will be carried out if legislation is required to implement the outcome of the consultation.
